The Southmoreland School District is required by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) to administer an achievement test called the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA). This year, learners in grades three through eight will be tested in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics. In addition, the science assessment will be administered to learners in fourth grade and in eighth grade. The assessment window has been determined as follows:

- ELA April 22-April 25, 2024
- MATHEMATICS APRIL 26-MAY 3, 2024
- SCIENCE APRIL 26-MAY 3, 2024

The annual Pennsylvania System School Assessment is a standards-based, criterion-referenced assessment which provides students, parents, educators and citizens with an understanding of student and school performance related to the attainment of proficiency of the academic standards. These standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science and Technology identify what a student should know and be able to do at varying grade levels. School districts possess the freedom to design curriculum and instruction to ensure that students meet or exceed the standards' expectations.

Every Pennsylvania student in grades 3 through 8 is assessed in English Language Arts and Math. Every Pennsylvania student in grades 4 and 8 is assessed in science.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT SCORES, PROVIDED ONLY TO THEIR RESPECTIVE SCHOOLS, CAN BE USED TO ASSIST TEACHERS IN IDENTIFYING STUDENTS WHO MAY BE IN NEED OF ADDITIONAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES, AND SCHOOL SCORES PROVIDE INFORMATION TO SCHOOLS AND DISTRICTS FOR CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION IMPROVEMENT DISCUSSIONS AND PLANNING.

IN COMPLIANCE WITH §4.51(A)(4) OF THE PA SCHOOL CODE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION APPROVED, "SPECIFIC CRITERIA FOR ADVANCED, PROFICIENT, BASIC AND BELOW BASIC LEVELS OF PERFORMANCE."



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The purpose of this assessment is to provide a direct performance measure of the learners' proficiency in attaining the mathematics and ELA standards. Learners who are absent will be scheduled to complete any portion of the test that they miss upon their return to school per the guidelines set forth by the Department of Education.

IN CHAPTER 4 OF THE PA CODE, PROVISIONS PERMIT PARENTS/GUARDIANS WHO, UPON INSPECTION OF THE TESTING MATERIALS, FIND THE ASSESSMENT TO BE IN CONFLICT WITH THEIR RELIGIOUS BELIEFS TO REQUEST THAT THEIR CHILD(REN) BE EXCUSED FROM THE ASSESSMENT. THIS WRITTEN REQUEST FROM THE PARENTS/GUARDIANS MUST BE ADDRESSED TO THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT. STUDENTS MAY NOT "OPT-OUT" OF TESTING WITHOUT PARENTS FOLLOWING THE PRESCRIBED DIRECTIONS. TO INSPECT TESTING MATERIALS, PARENTS/GUARDIANS ARE REQUIRED TO APPEAR IN PERSON, REVIEW THE ASSESSMENT IN THE PRESENCE OF SCHOOL PERSONNEL, AND SIGN A STATE APPROVED CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT (NO NOTES MAY BE TAKEN AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES MAY NOT BE USED). THIS REQUEST SHOULD BE MADE AT LEAST TWO WEEKS PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF THE TESTING WINDOW.

IF A LEARNER IN ANY WAY VIOLATES TEST SECURITY, THERE ARE CONSEQUENCES AT THE LOCAL AND STATE LEVEL. This is mandated by the PA Department of Education. In an era of cell phones, smartphones, and other electronic devices which can easily photograph and instantly share photographs, confidential and secure test materials can be easily compromised. Not only is it expensive to replace a compromised test item, the material contained in the PSSA and Keystone Exams is copyrighted property of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Copying or duplicating the material from the assessment, including the taking of a photograph of secure assessment material, is a violation of the federal Copyright Act. Penalties for violation of the Copyright Act may include the cost of replacing the compromised test item(s) or fines of no less than \$750 up to \$30,000 for a single violation (17 U.S.C. 101 et. seq).
